

Get Started | Planning Checklist

- Pray**
We can't emphasize enough that every step of the way as you plan your Poverty Sunday, pray! Ask God for His help and guidance.
- Talk with your church leadership**
To host a Poverty Sunday at your church, youth group, or small group, you need to get your pastor's or group leader's permission. Be sure print off the Mission and Vision PDF located on the Toolkit page. This will help explain to your church leadership how Poverty Sunday will educate and mobilize your congregation to stand with the poor in real, tangible, empowering and non-harmful ways.
- Set a Date**
Choose a date that's right for you and your church, youth group, or small group. It doesn't even have to be a Sunday!
- Register your event**
After your church leadership says "YES!" – make sure you register your event. Registration is easy, but VERY important. Registration ensures that we know about the event and can be available to answer questions and support you through the planning process!
